SHARING THE LANDSCAPE WITH BEARS AND LARGE CARNIVORES

In the south west corner of the province, ranchers share the landscape with a variety of large carnivores, including wolves, cougars, black bears, and grizzly bears. These wildlife species make their home here, but sometimes cause conflict with people. Impacts such as depredation of livestock or pets, consumption and spoilage of grain, silage, or crops, damage to beehives, grain bins, or buildings, and concern for human safety can all result from large carnivore conflicts. However, with proper management, it is possible for people and large carnivores to coexist harmoniously on the land.

The Waterton Biosphere Reserve Association works with landowners to encourage coexistence through the Carnivores and Communities Program. By reducing attractants for large carnivores, reducing economic impact on landowners, and enhancing resident safety, consequences of conflicts can be reduced or avoided.
