CREATING OR RENEWING AN ENVIRONMENTAL FARM PLAN

Maintaining a healthy environment is crucial to the growth and success of agricultural operations. The Environmental Farm Plan (EFP) is a voluntary farm assessment that can help producers identify environmental risks on their operations and develop plans to mitigate them.

Completing an EFP will identify what is already being done well and highlight where improvements could be made. This helps producers understand how they can optimize operational efficiency while reducing environmental impact and farm costs. There are also funding opportunities for projects that producers can access with a completed EFP, such as the Canadian Agricultural Partnership (CAP) programs. The plans must be renewed every 10 years.

ID characteristics: starts as rosette and can grow over 1m tall, leaves large, densely hairy, and grey-green, bright yellow flowers in a spike cluster at the top.


